Maïsadour welcomes the financial commitments of the State related to the fight against the avian influenza and will be fully ready by the 1st of October

Haut-Mauco, the 21st of July 2023. Following the announcements of the French Ministry of Agriculture and of food sovereignty related to the financial supports for the poultry and palmiped sector, Maïsadour wishes to welcome this commitment and to reaffirm that the Group will be to implement the vaccination for the duck sector starting from the 1st of October.

A needed and essential financial support for the poultry and palmiped sectors

Even if a major avian crisis was avoided last winter thanks to the implementation of the Adour Plan in 68 municipalities of the Gers, the Landes and the Pyrénées-Atlantiques, an unprecedented crisis occurred last May affecting all the links in the chain of the poultry and palmiped sectors. It was therefore necessary for the State to provide its support.

In parallel with the existing aid for breeders, the government has announced the implementation of a compensation scheme for the selection-incubation link. This is a very good news for the Maïsadour Group, which suffered losses of animals and non-production on its mating incubation in hatchings, guinea fowl and palmiped during the last months.

Maïsadour also welcomes that 85% of the vaccination campaign against the avian influenza that will start on the entire mainland France from the 1st of October is financed by the State. This unprecedented and ambitious project is essential for the sectors.

Concerning the implementation of the breeding for the 2023/2024 winter, Maïsadour, like the CIFOG and ANVOL inter-branch organizations, is still waiting for the compensation scheme related to the de-densification measures on the farms.

The Maïsadour Group will be ready by the 1st of October to implement the vaccination against the avian influenza.

After the heavy financial losses due to the latest avian crises not only in the South-West of France, but also in the West of France, the avian influenza vaccine is now a necessary and complementary solution to the biosecurity measures already in place in the territories.

The vaccine is eagerly expected by the breeders and the Maïsadour Group to allow a more serene production season. Maïsadour will be fully ready by the 1st of October to implement the vaccination: between 60,000 and 80,000 animals will be vaccinated every week. All the teams are currently working with the veterinarians on a large traceability system for vaccinated animals. Concerning the operational implementation of the vaccine: some vaccination teams are hired, the employees and the breeders are trained and a large work on logistics and schedules is conducted. Maïsadour is determined to do everything possible to ensure the success of this vaccination campaign.
